Christmas Pictionary: Word List 2021

Pictionary is one of our favorite games. It doesn't matter how skilled you are at drawing, you don't have to get up there and paint The Mona Lisa, a stick figure will do just fine. As long as your teammates can guess at what your clues mean, that's all that matters.

All you need is a timer, a list of Christmas words, four or more players, some pens, or markers, crayons, chalk, whatever you have! And a drawing board large enough for everyone to see - a dry erase board, plain paper, or chalkboard will work.

Christmas Pictionary is quite similar to [Christmas charades](#). The players divide into two teams, and each team takes turns sending one player up to take a word from the Santa hat or Christmas bowl.

The player then has one minute to draw clues for their team to guess, without speaking, acting, or using signals. Teams get one point for each correct answer, and the team with the most points when all the words are gone wins the game. Don't forget to give someone the job of keeping score, and a pen and paper to keep track!

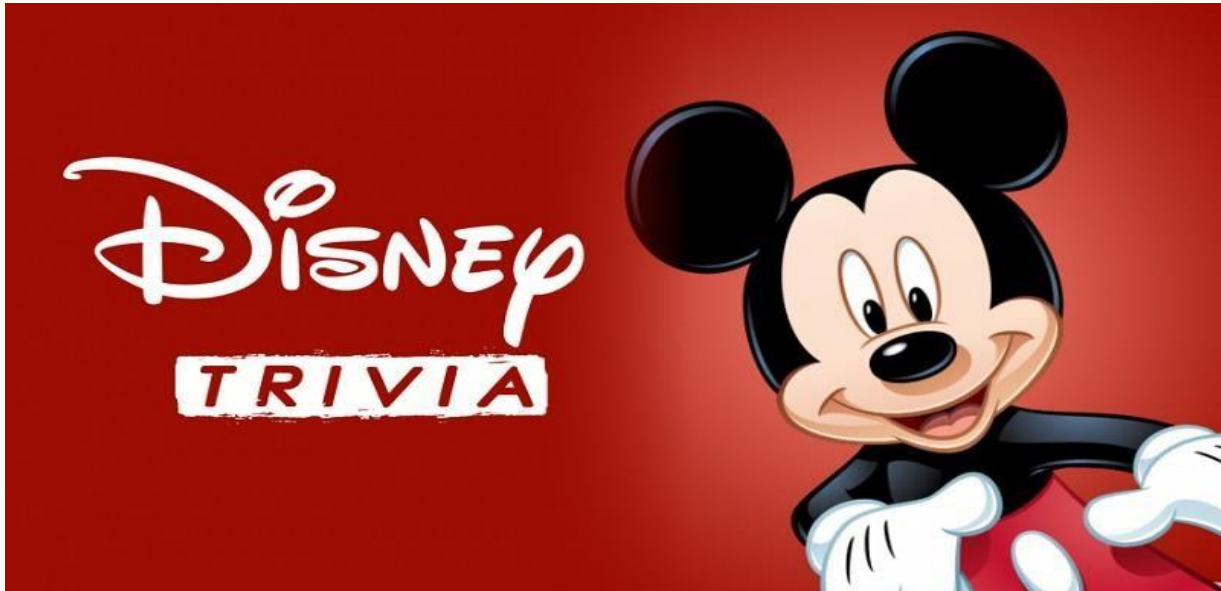
